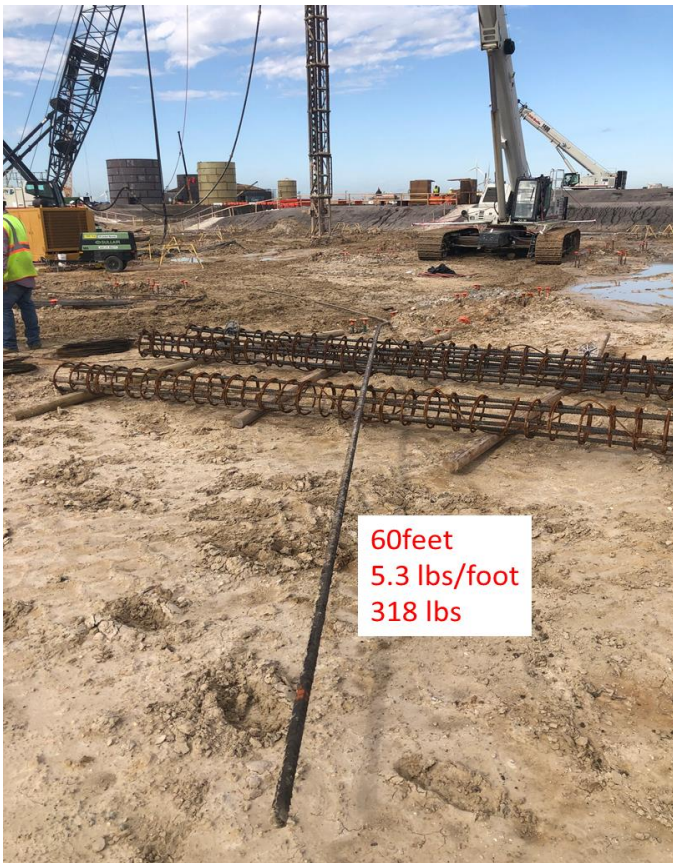

Purpose of Incident Hot Sheets:

- To make all jobs aware of any significant incidents
- To make sure all jobs relay the information to all Cajun employees by tool box safety meetings and document the meeting

Description:

An incident occurred while relocating two 60' center bars, from a laydown area to the work area, with a crane. As the operator lifted the center bars and tracked forward, one of the center bars slipped through the endless strap rigging (bars were rigged individually) and fell to the ground. All personnel were outside of the line of fire and no one was injured. This incident is currently in the process of a root cause analysis.



Contributing Factors:

- The rigger was utilizing a tag line, during the lift, to control the suspended load from a safe distance.
- The crane operator tracked forward, with the suspended load, causing the load to slightly bounce up and down.
- The center bars and rigging were wet/muddy, at the time in which the lift was conducted.
- While traveling, the center bar was able to slip through the endless strap rigging.

Key Focus Items:

- In order to minimize risk on our projects, material repositioning should be configured horizontally. We should limit vertical lifts of material to during the installation.
- All riggers and crane operators must verify and address the following, prior to conducting a lift:
 1. Verify that the rigging configuration is properly attached to the load, and in compliance with best practices, prior to lifting the load.
 2. Verify that the condition of the material, being lifted, does not present additional hazards to the lift (i.e. muddy, wet, sharp edges, tangled with other material, etc.).
 3. Ensure that all personnel are out of the line of fire of the load.
- Rigging equipment, while not in use, shall be staged/stored in a location to protect it from the elements. If the rigging equipment becomes unusable, due to the condition of the rigging, then the rigger must replace the rigging.

Corrective/Preventative Actions:

- Defined corrective/preventative actions will soon follow, once the root cause analysis is complete.
